It's that time of year again. I hope you, as a member of the Beverly Sail & Power Squadron, will enhance your boating knowledge and take a boating course. Whether it is a basic Piloting class, a specific elective, or an advanced navigation class, the squadron can probably meet your needs. If you have been a squadron member for a while, you have heard me taut the importance of maintaining and improving your boating skills both for your enjoyment of boating and safety on the water. Don't forget, GPS will not necessarily get you home if you do not know some of the basic rules of the sea. Boating ability and comfort at sea cannot be purchased at West Marine.

The slate of USPS courses offered and their description is posted on our website, www.beverly-usps.org, (navigate to the educational pages). Please visit and make your selection. You will notice that only a couple of courses are currently scheduled with a date and location. However, if you wish to take any of the USPS courses, click on the email link and let me know. If at least 5 students show interest, the course will be scheduled. Let me know your preferred evening, also. If we do not have enough students for a class, I will try and find an alternate site such as the Marblehead Squadron to provide you with a class.

If the course is being planned, please also register with the email link.

If you do not have access to the web, call me direct and we can discuss your options. My number is 978-777-4740. I am always available to discuss the USPS educational program and your needs.

Last year, our education program was very disappointing. Not because of the content, but because of lack of interest among squadron members. Unless there is interest in a course, obviously we will not plan to schedule that course. Last year, we had scheduled almost every course for the year and made classroom arrangements. Every course was cancelled due to low enrollment. We did reschedule Seamanship and Piloting, however, for our newest members and got just enough students to conduct the class. (Very successful classes for the participants I might add) To prevent this from happening again, courses will not generally be scheduled until we have enough interest to justify them.

On another front, USPS is now offering a series of seminars. These short seminars are targeted

to specific topics and needs with a two-hour format. This may be an option to those of you who do not have the time or need to take a regular multi-week course. Currently there are four seminars available, VHF Radio, How to Read a Chart, GPS, On Board Weather Forecasting. If you are interested in one of these seminars, let me know. They sound great. I will be further promoting these to you in a future notice. Hopefully we can schedule a few of these during the year, perhaps on a regular basis.

I hope that many members will take the opportunity to participate in a class and reap the benefits of membership. I hope you had a great summer on the water and used your USPS education. #







Meeting Minutes

Dinner:

Tonight Squadron Meeting started with a Free Macaroni & Cheese with Kielbasa dinner prepared by Colleen Libby & Ed Lamphier, accompanied by salad and bread. Donated desserts were available.

Guest Speaker:

Jim McAllister- Salem's Local Historian, Photographer, Author, Teacher and Tour Guide gave a very interesting presentation about "Life and Death at Sea - Salem Ships Out". At 1945 PM P/Lt/C Alex Pszenny introduced our speaker for this evening. Jim McAllister said that about 75% of men worked in maritime ventures. Salem's young boys were taken to work as cabin boys- most times they did not volunteer their services. The living conditions on board these ships were very crowded, had salted beef and pork, brine, hard tack, and bugs. Health conditions at sea were even worse. Some of the diseases on board ranged from small pox, yellow fever, and typhoid fever. There were many accidents in the yardarms, such as the men falling or being knocked off. Jim told stories about the pirates, and mutinies that were always a constant problem that Sea Captains had to cope with. It was not a glamorous life being a pirate in those days - nothing like what we've all seen in the movies. A rousing applause was given to our speaker this eve-

Boating Course: P/C John Hagar spoke about getting publicity out on Safe Boating Day of May 22, 2006, as mentioned above. Coast Guard required life preservers especially the newer SUSPENDER TYPE, they are not on the person they do not count as a count toward the required on board amount. Other problems with kids drinking and boating, etc were mentioned.

The great GPS hunt

Have you been in the market for an inexpensive fishfinder/ GPS/ Depth sounder? I want to share some information with the members that might be as useful to you as it was to me.

I bought a used 22 foot CAL sailboat in good condition this spring and have sailed by compass since I was a kid, so I didn't need one of those new fangled GPS things. My wife, on the other hand, likes toys and also would feel much more secure if she knew each second of every day her exact location on this round globe -- so we compromised and got a GPS (which I think takes all the sport out of sailing).

Now the pressure was on: she wanted a GPS; I wanted a depth sounder and I also didn't want to spend an arm and a leg to get one. So, let the shopping begin.

I looked at units that would do all the above and ranged from a low of 400-500 dollars to a high into the 1500 to 2000 dollar range. Just as I was ready to plead my inability to meet her needs (a functional GPS) and my needs (cheap), lo and behold I was in Dick's Sporting Goods and found the Eagle model "Cuda 250 S/Map" that cost me all of \$199 (on sale and on tax free day) with GPS (WAAS) depth finder/ fish finder. 1000 waypoints and about 30 other goodies that I would not have expected to find on such an inexpensive device. So, I BOUGHT IT!

I mounted it on the CAL 22 at the bulkhead where the old (defunct) depth finder was. The manual shows the transponder mounted off the transom of a power boat, but also shows how to use it as a shoot-through-hull unit. I mounted the transponder against the hull under a quarter berth with marine epoxy that I bought at ACE Hardware for 6 dollars and I am thrilled with the results. So is Karen. If you want a great and inexpensive GPS (it includes the power boat mounting bracket which I didn't use) go get yourself an Eagle Cuda and tell 'em Alex sent you. Their website is www.eaglesonar.com. By the way the warranty info indicates that Eagle units are actually made by Lorance of Canada; a very solid name in the marine electronics business. Enjoy!

P.S. if you have similar tales to tell about great equipment buys, solving problems you encounter on your boat or handy tips to use "on the water" please share them with us. We can all use a little help from time to time. #

Following the meal, the SEO and various instructors will discuss the Squadron's fall educational program. This will be your opportunity to register for classes.




