
From the SEO





Guest Speaker:

Our own P/D/C Linda Seal told about her experiences in Belgium, piloting house-barges on the canal system. A slide presentation was shown with the assistance of Lt/C Dick Winskowicz. Her trip started a few days earlier in London, Linda Seal took the Chunnel to France. There were four house-barges, 21 people all together on a ten day canal cruise. No Sunday travel. Everyone was given a Navigation book of the canals to use in navigating. All took a turn operating the boat and the locks throughout the journey. They would have breakfast on board the boats and lunch. In the evening, some members ventured to try the local cuisine in the area they stopped for the night. There were parties on some of the house-boat barges, etc. There was a lot of fun on this trip. During some of their stops, they would pick up local food provisions, etc. Slides were shown of what these house-boat barges looked like and the group who took this trip with Linda. Very interesting views of the canals and scenery. Linda told about how some of the canal locks were a little tricky to maneuver, what with the locks being small and the presence of larger boats in the canal. The weather was generally in the 50 to 60 degrees. Most of the local people they met on their journey were very surprised that they were Americans.



By the way, any dessert donations will be appreciated.


