Just in case you missed taking a class this winter, the squadron is planning to conduct the Piloting class starting Tuesday, April 1st at the JYC. If you haven't taken the new piloting class, I hope that you will consider taking this course and learn some new techniques to safely navigate your boat using and understanding GPS.

The Junior Navigation class is finishing up this week with four students completing the classroom sessions and taking the open book exam. Speaking with the students, they all were pleased with the new JN-2007 class and although they may not be planning any offshore voyages, the knowledge they have gained from the course will make their boating this summer much more enjoyable.

COOPERATIVE CHARTING.....

For years, Beverly Sail & Power Squadron has participated in the program to update nautical charts. Any change or correction to charts can be reported. For example, the Salem Willows power station formerly had five smoke stacks, now reduced to three. The Hawthorne Cove Marina in Salem changed the orientation of their floats by 90 degrees. Two of the local charts, the small craft chart covering the area from Boston to Portsmouth, NH, and the Salem Harbor chart, have been adopted by Beverly and Marblehead Sail &Power Squadrons.

For the past two years Bob Mazzarino and I have spent time updating the marina facilities on the Danvers River. The small craft charts include a listing of marine facilities of use to boaters and need to be updated periodically since changes take place in what is offered. We hope that the harbor chart which covers both Lynn and Salem Harbors and the Danvers River, might be converted to a Small Craft Chart, and the info on marine facilities would be included on the chart instead of only being included in the local Coast Pilot.

For your information, all NOAA charts can now be downloaded, however, most of us do not have a chart sized printer.

The year for Co-op Charting runs thru the end of March. The information on charts is only as good as the updates that have been reported to NOAA. If you have any ideas for any updates to local charts, please call me: (978) 927-2932 or email: jcur@localnet.com.

VESSEL SAFETY CHECK

Beverly Sail & Power Squadron currently has four Vessel Safety Examiners: Jim Curran, Dick Salter, Herb Ryan, and Karen Arcisz.

Please keep us in mind when your boat is ready for a VSC. You can get the information about what you need to have onboard by contacting any one of us.

In the last few years, we have scheduled VSC's at Pope's Landing, Danversport, Jubilee Y.C., Bass Haven Y. C. and the Gloucester Marina.. Some of us will do a VSC by appointment wherever your boat is. (See if you can line up your boating buddies for the same day, too!.)

If you have any suggestions for additional Vessel Safety Check locations, please call or e-mail me.

We would like to have more Vessel Examiners in our squadron. It is not hard to become a VE:

- Self-paced study from the book
- ◆ Take the online VE exam at www.usps.org (or if that is not convenient, we could use the paper and pencil method)
- ◆ A mentor guides you through the first five Vessel Checks (required to certify)
- It's fun and you get to see other people's boats
- ♦ Women are welcome to become VEs
- No heavy lifting or 'policing' Vessel
 Examiners are NOT law enforcement agents,
 but are simply looking at whether someone has
 the required equipment on board and giving out
 info about regulations and USPS/Beverly Sail
 & Power Squadron.
- Vessel Checks sometimes lead to new members
- It qualifies you for a Merit Mark!

WELCOME TO EMILY MURPHY, OUR MARCH SPEAKER

Emily A. Murphy (B.A., St. John's College, M.A., American Studies, Pennsylvania State University) is a Park Ranger at Salem Maritime National Historic Site. She is currently pursuing a Ph.D. in American Studies at Boston University. Her dissertation, with a working title of American Medici: The Derby Family and Their Rise to Power in the British Atlantic World, discusses the merchants of 18th Century Salem.

Emily is also an intern in the American Decorative Arts Department at the Peabody Essex Museum, and a published author. Among her publications are a walking tour, Nathaniel Hawthorne's Salem; a booklet, Merchants, Clerks, Citizens, and Soldiers: A History of the Second Corps of Cadets, for the National Park Service; and A Complete and Generous Education, a book on the history of St. John's College. She has also written and lectured extensively on Early American History, Maryland history, women's history, and photographic preservation.

She has lectured on several occasions at the Salem Athenæum on the Derby family, and participated in last year's Trails & Sails event locally by giving a talk titled "Nathaniel Hawthorne's Salem". She spoke of the job he loathed, the homes where he lived, and the family he loved.

At our March meeting, she will examine the contribution of Salem merchant Elias Hasket Derby to the privateering efforts of the area, and answer the burning questions about the mariners from Salem and Beverly who contributed to the American Revolution war effort through privateering: What is a privateer? How is a privateer different from a pirate? Who were they?

In Mermoriam

A memorial service was held on February 17, 2008 for Clayton E. (Tim) Whiting in Salem at the National Park Site, Derby Wharf on the Friendship.

Tim was very active in the Power Squadron since 1963, both in Beverly and Marblehead. He taught Marlinspike with Theo Kuliopulos for several years in Marblehead.

Tim also was involved in rigging both the Constitution in Boston and the Friendship in Salem. He will be remembered for all of his achievements, and as a "really nice guy who did a lot for us" by many.
