



FROM THE COMMANDER

We survived Hurricane Irene with little damage to boats in the Beverly-Gloucester area.

The winds were in the 40 to 60 mph range by the time it reached us Sunday and boats in Beverly

Harbor were certainly testing their moorings while the wind was coming out of the east at the peak of the storm.

Watching boats in the most exposed areas of the harbor rock up and down, pulling hard on their lines, I was glad to see that only one in Beverly Harbor broke free. It came from the Salem Willows moorings into the Jubilee moorings and nestled up to one of the JYC boats. The JYC owner went out on Sunday afternoon in an inflatable and with a helper (an exciting ride, for sure - both wearing their PFDs) and put fenders between the boats. She rafted the wanderer to her own boat to keep them both safe for the remainder of Sunday. JYC was full of spectators and several pairs of binoculars were trained on the whole exercise.

There was also talk and a newspaper report on Monday that someone had tried to SWIM out to his boat during the storm - truly a bad decision. The Beverly Harbormaster stopped him and pulled him out of the water and the local constabulary gave him a talking to.

Several boat owners in Swampscott and other areas of the state were not as fortunate. Most boat owners removed canvas, checked their lines, tested bilge pumps and took other precautions to minimize damage. The floats at the Jubilee Yacht

Club were hauled out and will be returned to the water shortly. A day after the storm, marinas were quickly returning to normal. The weather forecast for the rest of the week looks good, so put the canvas back on, remove the extra lines and enjoy the rest of the boating season.
