



AWAITING RESULTS OF PILOTING EXAMS

Of the sixteen student who were enrolled in the Piloting course offered at

The Jubilee Yacht Club this fall, fourteen have completed and turned-in their exams which are being graded at USPS headquarters in Raleigh, NC. Two students declined to take the exam and two others have elected to postpone their exam till January.

Although the exam contains multiple-choice questions, the students must plot courses with precision accuracy on their "Bowditch Bay Charts." All sixteen students expressed appreciation for the hands-on exercises and instruction.

The students expect to receive their grades and exam critique in late January.

JYC LAUNCH DRIVERS TO GET NEW 2015 ABC COURSE

The Squadron has been asked to provide the boating safety course (ABC) for the prospective launch drivers at the Jubilee Yacht

Club for the upcoming boating season. Successfully completion of the course will enable the launch drivers to fulfill one of their Coast Guard and Massachusetts requirements for launch drivers. USPS has just released a revised 2015 edition of the course, which will be used in the class. This will be an accelerated course to be given over three consecutive Monday nights beginning January 18th.

Ray Tilton will lead the team of instructors. The course will be offered only to the prospective launch drivers and other members of JYC. As a special service to JYC the launch drivers will receive the course and exam free of charge while other JYC members enrolled will be offered a 30% discount price.

BEVERLY- MARBLEHEAD VSC'S LEAD DISTRICT

The Beverly-Marblehead team of vessel examiners led the District in vessel safety checks in 2015. During the latest exam season, which ended November 30th, the squadron's seven-man team completed 92 examinations out of a total of 156 in the District.

The 92 exams were still shy of the 101 completed by the Beverly Squadron in 2010 but it is still a significant achievement. Kudos to the Beverly-Marblehead VSC team of Jack Reed, Jim Curran, Dick Salter, Skip Whittaker, Liz Wolfe, Gerry Clarke and Chairman, Walter Riley.
