Last Sunday was the final day of the 9-day New England Boat

Show at the Boston Exhibition and Convention Center.
District 12 arranged for a booth to represent all the eastern
Massachusetts Squadrons as well as District 14 (the Cape) and
District 19 (northern New England Squadrons.)

BOAT SHOW SUCCESS

The booth was staffed by over thirty volunteer members who answered visitor questions and handed out USPS promotional literature. In addition to handouts containing the upcoming schedules of courses arranged by location, the main feature of the booth was the District's own Boating Skills Virtual Trainer.

The Trainer allows visitors a simulated experience handling the controls of an 18-foot center-console Boston Whaler. Visitors sitting at the controls could practice docking, mooring, and boat handling through a slalom course while watching water, navigational aids and features surrounding the Trainer on three side-by-side computer screens. All visitors using the controls were asked to wear a life jacket and asked to rate the level of reality of the experience.

The USPS booth attracted hundreds of visitors anxious to try the Trainer as well as obtain the schedule of upcoming courses and their locations. Visitors were asked to supply their name and email information so that local Squadrons can contact and promote their courses directly to individual visitors indicating an interest.

BOATING SEASON ABC COURSES AVILABLE NOW!

Starting the first week of March the squadron is offering the basic safe boating course, ABC at five separate locations as well as the much requested coastal navigation course "Piloting."

The ABC is our basic 7-week introductory course for both power and sail boaters. It is a perfect refresher for seasoned skippers as well as novice mates and young crew members. The course was updated and revised in 2015 and Massachusetts has supplied a new section and exam to compliment the federal portion of the course. Successful students receive a Certificate of Completion and wallet card confirming that the student has met the educational requirements for boat operation in all 50 states.

Beginning Thursday, March 17 we are again offering our popular inland and coastal navigation course entitled "Piloting." The ten-week course will be held at the Jubilee Yacht Club in Beverly, from 7 to 9 PM. The weekly class will generally be held on Thursdays with some weeks on Tuesdays instead.

This course embraces GPS as the primary navigation tool while covering enough traditional techniques so the student will be able to find their way if their GPS fails



Course Description

This course covers the basics of coastal and inland navigation and embraces GPS as a primary navigation tool while covering enough of traditional techniques so that the student will be able to find their way even if their GPS fails. The course includes many in-class exercises, developing the student's skills through hands-on practice and learning. Ten classes of two hours each are scheduled for presentation of this course. Topics covered include:

Charts and their interpretation.

Navigation aids and how they point to safe water.

Plotting courses and determining direction and distance.

The Mariner's Compass and converting Magnetic and True North.

Use of GPS—typical GPS displays and information they provide, setting up way-points and routes.

SAVE-THE-DATE

Your Squadron is planning on another spring "kick-off" social - - - one for the 2016 season. Look for details that will be forthcoming by mid-April - - - but to "whet your whistle" a bit, the date will be Friday evening, May 20th that will include a dinner at the Corinthian Yacht Club.

The speaker program will relate to "The greatest small boat rescue by the Coast Guard" and will bring to us three individuals who will report on the loss of the Tanker "SS Pendleton" off Cape Cod and the nearly unbelievable rescue effort that occurred during a terrific Northeast storm of February 1952.

"Many Brave Hearts Are Asleep in the Deep" - - - Memories of the loss of the SS Pendleton (and SS Fort Mercer) remains vivid with many after all these years. 1952 was about the time your new Squadron Commander became a "weather nut" and closely followed Don Kent's daily broadcasts, both TV and radio. In listening intensely to Streeter Stuart's "play-by-play" action on WBZ concerning his news broadcasts of the two sinkings, his reports only served to heighten the drama concerning the break-up of the two T-2 tankers "Pendleton" and "Fort Mercer" only a few miles apart, some 10 miles off Cape Cod. Both losses were later attributed to "bad steel" used in their wartime construction. The steel plates contained a high degree of carbon, giving all T-2 tankers great strength but, as was later to be discovered, the plating would also be highly susceptible to brittleness brought on by the combination of twisting action created by high seas and extreme cold temperatures. Having a presentation of the two losses, with focus on the SS Pendleton and the rescue of all but one of her crew by the Coast Guard "Lifesaving" boat, CG36500 some 64 years after the fact, will be a high tribute to the United States Coast Guard.
