### **Notes from the Commander**

You will read inside this issue that the news for the Squadron overall is very good. Membership is up. Plans for our summer social events, fall courses, and off-season dinner meetings into early next year are in place or well advanced. However, there is one area that causes me some concern. Several Bridge members now serve in multiple capacities. Those individuals deserve our highest praise and appreciation for their efforts "above and beyond". However, in a way, their dedication masks a problem: The work of keeping the Squadron going is done almost entirely by a very small fraction of the membership. Signs of strain have begun to appear. Administrative Officer Lt/C Ray Tilton is stepping down from his second job as Hannah's Banner editor effective with the mailing of this issue. Ray has done an outstanding job as editor for several years. This was recognized by National with a 2016 Distinctive Performance for Communications award for Hannah's Banner. And I believe that this was not the first time in recent years that Ray earned us this award! If nobody steps forward to succeed Ray as editor then publication of Hannah's Banner will be suspended. Squadron news and announcements will only be distributed electronically, probably in an abbreviated format similar to that of National's news blasts.

Also, Treasurer Lt/C Dale Smith is seeking help with his jobs, the second one being Webmaster, in anticipation of stepping down from both roles in the not too distant future. I note that we also received a 2016 Distinctive Performance for Communications award for our website, all due to Dale's efforts. Of greater importance, however, is that Treasurer is one of the four Bridge positions that squadrons are *required* to have filled. Lack of a successor for Dale could put the Squadron's very existence at risk.

## Commander's Notes, continued:

Finally, some words about leadership succession in general, and a plea. Most current Bridge members have served as officers previously with one of our three predecessor squadrons (Beverly, Gloucester, Marblehead). Three are Past Commanders. While having some "corporate memory" on the Bridge is essential, so is having some "new blood". It appears that we will need a new Treasurer as soon as next year. Other vacancies may also occur before next March. The only requirements for Bridge service, besides a desire to help the squadron move forward, are having passed one advanced course and having obtained one merit mark. Please, please, if you fit this description and are willing to help lead the Squadron contact me or Nominations Committee chair Bill Ghen.

# **District 12 Activities**



#### NEWS FROM THE EDUCATION DEPAR TMENT

It was another very active school year for the Education Department. Squadron instructors led four ABC introductory boating classes at four different locations in Gloucester, Beverly and Marblehead. Of the eighty-five registered students for these classes sixty-six completed and passed the course.

2017 saw a decrease in enrollment in our ABC classes , no doubt due to the additional competition from lower priced courses offered by both the Coast Guard Auxiliary and Massachusetts Environmental Police. Classroom instruction however still appears to be favored over on-line courses especially since all New England states require mandatory proctored exams in order for students to qualify for certification. Also, students appreciate instruction from experienced teachers with local knowledge.

The squadron also offered our Piloting course again this spring at the Jubilee Yacht Club in Beverly. Eleven students took and completed the exacting 7-day exam this month. An additional six students have postponed their exams to later in the year. Several of these students were unable to take the exam due to their participation in the Marion to Bermuda sailing race.

The squadron is also launching a special two-day (8 hour) ABC class sponsored by the Sandy Bay Yacht Club in Rockport. This is an accelerated ABC class starting mid-July geared for students 12 and older who desire to earn their Massachusetts Safe Boating Certificate. P/Commander Jack Reed will be leading the instruction.

The Education Department is grateful to the Squadron for the purchase of brand new Dell laptop computer and projector. Both pieces of equipment performed admirably during the Piloting course this spring.

Finally, <u>hats off to all the squadron instructors</u> who volunteer their time and efforts to support our excellent educational program. It was another fine year of instruction.

#### A FREE VESSEL SAFETY CHECK FOR YOUR BOAT

Please don't postpone getting your free VSC for your boat from one of our squadron's six certified examiners. Before you embark on that cruise; don't forget to get a 2017 VSC. Vessel Safety Checks are simple, free and can save you time and money. These are voluntary exams and there is no penalty should your boat fail. Your examiner will provide you with a detailed list of deficiencies that need to be corrected in order to comply with state and federal safety regulations.

Our Squadron VSC examiners will be available this summer at various marinas and clubs in the area. Check times, dates and locations of VSC visits on the squadron web site. Our examiners can also schedule an individual VSC on your boat if that is more convenient for you.

## Marion to Bermuda Race by Bob Duncan, SN

The 40th Anniversary Marion Bermuda race started a June 9. The 51 boat fleet in the 645 nautical mile race from Marion, Massachusetts headed south out of Buzzards Bay to the finish line of St. David's Lighthouse in Bermuda.

51 sailboats entered in the FOUNDERS DIVISION which is for yachts 32 to 80 feet that wish to race with a cruising sail inventory. Nine of the boats, including Tiara, a 36' Cape Dory with a crew of 6 out of Beverly's Jubilee Yacht Club, sailed in the Celestial Navigation Division using only celestial sites. The Marion to Bermuda yacht race is the only ocean race to Bermuda that offers a celestial navigation prize. The Royal Hamilton Amateur Dinghy Club hosts the race in Bermuda and there are several special race trophies within the Marion Bermuda Race based on a boats class A, B, C, or D, crew size, all family crew and celestial navigation.

Tiara finished the race and awarded 2nd place in Class D, 2nd place overall and 2nd place in Celestial Navigation.

Our son Brian Duncan was asked by the owner and captain of Tiara John Ring to crew and of course he accepted. We wanted to be part of the cheering crew and as such went to the kickoff ceremony at the Beverly Yacht Club in Marion on June 8th and enjoyed a buffet dinner. On June 9<sup>th</sup>, dockside, we watched the crew finish stocking the boat. Bonnie made a fish chowder which was frozen and also picked up three loaves of Italian bread from Virgilio's in Gloucester which was stowed below.

Forecasts earlier in the week called for a northeaster to pass off the coast but fortunately that weather system passed more to the south. Looked like the start would be typical for Buzzards Bay with increasing SW winds during the day but more about that in the next Banner from Bob Dugan the navigator.

Bonnie and I cruised to Bermuda on the BREAKAWAY a 4000 passenger cruise ship out of NYC departing Sunday June 11 arriving Bermuda June 14 and thought that should be the earliest the boats racing from Marion would arrive. We met with Brian's wife Tricia who flew to Bermuda on Wednesday to join the celebration.

Tiara crossed the finish line around midnight on Wednesday June 14 and after crossing, was required to head off shore since no boats are allowed to enter harbor after dark. We met with Brian Friday after he cleared customs and congratulated him on Tiara's unbelievable finish. Our ship departed Friday afternoon at 3:00. Brian and Tricia took a plane back Sunday.

Everything worked out so well. Couldn't have been any better.

# Come join us for another sailing **ADVENTURE**!!!

Flushed with the success of last year's cruise, your squadron has organized another 3-hour sail aboard the 122-foot Schooner "ADVENTURE" out of Gloucester. The cruise date will be on the Friday afternoon of August 18, 2017. The 91 year-old Schooner "ADVENTURE" is the last of the famous Grand Banks fishing schooners that sailed out of Gloucester and Boston. For decades, she fished the Banks under the watchful eye of Captain Leo Hines before she was sold In 1964 to Captain Jim Sharp who had her rebuilt and sailed her as a windjammer for nearly twenty-four years out of Camden, Maine. In 1988, Captain Sharp donated "ADVENTURE" to the people of Gloucester to be preserved as Gloucester's historic tall ship and to be used to inform and educate the public about the important role of fishing in American history. "ADVENTURE" was declared a National Historic Landmark in 1994 and has recently received an extensive restoration.

Again, the sailing date will be Friday late afternoon on August 18<sup>th</sup>. Boarding will be at 3:30 and we will plan to depart her pier at <u>4 Harbor Loop</u> in Gloucester by not later than 4:00 PM for our 3-hour sail.



To join us for the sail, your reservations found on the next page of this announcement will be "a must"! Please be certain to use the page for making your required reservations. Please note that "Walk-Ons" will not be permitted for boarding this cruise.

The price will be \$30.00 per person, which will include plated hors d'ouvres and soft drinks, both of which will be available once we are underway. If you desire something other than soft drinks, you will be required to BYOB.

### Volunteer Days at Bakers Island Light Station, Salem

Essex Heritage is seeking volunteers to help this summer with maintenance and repairs at the Bakers Island Light Station. The volunteer work includes hauling lumber and other supplies to the property, mowing, clearing brush, removing bittersweet, cleaning, scraping and painting (exterior and interior), gutter repair/replacement, and more. Unskilled labor is welcome. Skills in carpentry and plumbing are always appreciated too. The light station is located on Bakers Island about 4 miles from the port of Salem. Volunteers will be transported from Salem to the island aboard *Naumkeag*, a 32' landing craft, which is the same vessel used for the public tours. The boat trip takes about 20 minutes each way. *Naumkeag* departs from the dock next to the Salem Ferry on Blaney St. and drops volunteers at the light station beach. There is no dock available on the island.

Please mention that you heard about this opportunity through the Beverly-Marblehead Sail and Power Squadron. If you want to organize your own special workday for 10 or more friends, we will be happy to try to accommodate this.

Background: The Bakers Island Light Station is owned and operated by Essex Heritage, the regional non-profit organization whose mission is to preserve and enhance the important historic and natural places of Essex County. The property was deeded to Essex Heritage in 2014. Essex Heritage offers tours of the property on Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays from mid-June to early September.
